Devotional Thought...

Psalm 91:11-12

“For he will command his angels concerning you
to guard you in all your ways.
On their hands they will bear you up,
lest you strike your foot against a stone.”

I used to love the fanciful notion of angels among us. Guardian angels. Loved ones, gone from this world, reaching down from heaven to guide us—keep track of our lives—protect us from harm.

But, I wonder why I ever thought we needed them? These are all things Jesus Himself promised to do for us.

Last January, God provided me with an angel. She didn't show up in a glowing, white robe or swoop in on gossamer wings. But rather, she appeared wearing a black bathing suit and a straw hat. Jill was an EMT from Canada vacationing—as we were—in Mexico.

When I slipped and fell near the pool, she didn't hesitate to leave her lounge chair to come and help me. She assessed the damage, determined my shoulder was broken, made me a sling from a pillowcase, and supervised fellow sunbathers in getting me up from the cement and on to a wheel chair. Her concern for us continued almost daily until we could finally come home.

Like most disasters, this one came without warning—no time to pray. But, God knew who I needed, and she appeared!

Psalm 91 is encouraging and hugely reassuring. But, it doesn't say bad things won't ever come to God's faithful people. It reassures us that He is present, always, in everything. He will give us what we need to find our way out of despair.

Maybe God wants us to be the angels over whom He “has command”. Maybe we are the ones He sends out to help “guide” others in “all their ways”—during happy times and perilous ones.

God's Holy Spirit lives in each of us. I think He probably longs for us to follow Him and become his angels.

But, He requires a lot, and it can be difficult:

Be kind. Act fairly and with humility. Be aware. Don't look away from other people's troubles. Don't give up on anyone. Treat everyone with respect. But mostly, He requires that we trust Him.

As ordinary, everyday angels, perhaps we can help make the light of Jesus' love shine brightly in our world.
