## Chapter 7: Do Not Worry

Abraham and I continued to listen as Jesus taught. The more I heard, the more confused I became. There were so many lessons that Jesus shared that seemed impossible to live out. I wasn't sure what to do. So, I just kept listening and writing in my journal, trying to take it all in, trying to learn what Jesus was teaching.

"Malachi, do you think we worry too much?" Abraham asked one afternoon.

We had just listened to Jesus tell us not to worry. He started off by saying that no one can serve two masters. I understood that all too well! When I was back at home, I found myself in the position when my dad wanted me to do one thing, but my uncle wanted something completely different. They were supposed to be working together, so it was difficult to know what to do. There wasn't a way to make them both happy. When Jesus said you can't serve both God and money that made sense to me.

Then Jesus went on to say that we should not worry about our lives, about what we eat or drink, nor should we worry about our bodies or what we will wear. After all, the birds don't plant or harvest, but they have plenty to eat. And the lilies don't labor or spin, but they are beautifully dressed.

Jesus finished by saying something I had written down in my journal just as he said it: *But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.*

This is what I was thinking about as Abraham asked me his question. I shook my head to clear my thoughts before I answered him.

"What do you mean?" I responded to Abraham.

"Well, Malachi, it seems that everyday we scurry around hunting something to eat. Wondering what we will find. Hoping we aren't noticed as we forage. We seem to spend a lot of time worrying about what we are going to eat," Abraham said.

I didn't answer right away, and Abraham didn't push. He could tell I was thinking about what he had said. He asked a good question. We did spend a lot of time working to get food and wondering where we would find our next meal. Were we worrying too much, was Jesus asking us to trust him more?

I finally shook my head in confusion and said that I simply didn't know. We spent the rest of the afternoon gathering some food and thinking.

That evening as we sat in the firelight watching and listening to the disciples discuss their day, I turned to Abraham and said, "I've been thinking about what you asked earlier. Maybe we are worrying too much."

“What should we do? We have to eat. Are we supposed to wait for food to drop in our laps? What does it mean not to worry about our lives, what we will eat or what we will wear?” Abraham said in frustration.

“Look at this,” and I showed him what I had written in my journal: *But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.* “I think Jesus is trying to tell us that we need to put God first. Instead of worrying about ourselves and what we need, he is asking us to trust him with all our needs.”

“Does that mean we shouldn’t forage for food?” Abraham asked skeptically.

“I don’t think so. I think it means that we should trust that God will provide. He will show us where the food is. He will be with us. Even on days when there isn’t much to eat, God is still present and watching over us. I think God is asking us to put him first in our lives,” I answered.

“Not as easy as it sounds,” Abraham said quietly.

I nodded, because honestly, I didn’t think it sounded very easy. There were so many unknowns in life. Would one of the disciples find us in their bags? Would we get stepped on as we walked with them? Would we find food? Would we get left behind? Would we ever see our families again? There were so many questions, so many things I worried about in the quiet of the night. Yet, Jesus had said do not worry.

As I continued to contemplate Jesus’ words, I focused on his words to seek first his kingdom and his righteousness. There would always be questions. There would always be uncertainties. Life was full worries. It wasn’t that they would go away, but instead of focusing on them, God calls us to place our focus on him. It helps to put things into perspective. Abraham and I would still need to be careful and hunt for food, but we could trust that God was taking care of us in the midst of our days.

That night as Abraham and I settled in to sleep, I quietly committed myself to God. I asked him to help me trust in him. I went to sleep knowing there would be difficult times ahead but resting in the joy of placing my faith in God. Following Jesus was the best choice I had ever made.
