# Updated Church Directory Is Now Live!

If you check out the directory on our website, you may notice it looks a little different. Last year, we began overhauling the directory portion of the website to streamline how the office stores information.

Everyone who completed a contact form and gave us permission is visible on the online directory. The directory is still password-protected (with the same password as before), so only those with the password have access to the information. Please call the office if you need the password.

# Using the New Directory

Once you type in the password, you have several different options to find congregants' names.

- 1. Type a name into the search bar on the top left of the page, and every person with that name will appear.
- 2. Click on a letter of the alphabet to see all members whose last names start with that letter.
- 3. Use the link above the search bar titled "PDF Version." This opens a new screen that shows the entire directory in one document.


### Soup & Salad Dinner at MacQueen Hall

# Devotional Thought...

It's February! Everywhere you look you see hearts. Love is in the air! Have you ever stopped to think about the greatest love in your life? Someone who loves you *without* judgement or conditions. Someone who loves you just as you are. That person is Jesus. Jesus not only loves us, but he also taught us *how* to love.

Think about what Jesus taught us in the first four books of the New Testament – Love God, love others, Love your enemies, Walk the extra mile, "Observe how Christ loved us. His love was not cautious but extravagant. He didn't love in order to get something from us but to give everything of himself to us. Love like that."

Turn the other cheek. What examples of love and how to live Jesus gave us!

Dr. Les Parrot says, "The Jesus model of love inspires us in following the best way to live, 'the most excellent way'" (1 Corinthians 12:31b, NIV).

Parrot says if you want to love like Jesus, you've got to . . .

- 1. become more *mindful* less detached;
- 2. become more approachable less exclusive;
- 3. become more graceful less judgmental;
- 4. become more bold less fearful; and
- 5. become more self-giving less self-absorbed.

While these may sound difficult, they are worth trying. Parrot says, "Jesus gives us practical steps to love in extraordinary ways. He calls us to embody these five qualities. Are they difficult? You bet. But not insurmountable. Will you and I fail in living them out? Absolutely. But don't be discouraged. For it's in our failed attempts that we learn to better travel the most excellent way."
