The Adventure Continues: Jesus Drives Out an Evil Spirit

I am so relieved that no one has spotted me in their bag. Humans always get squeamish when they see me, and I would not have wanted to miss a single moment of these past few weeks. I never knew that traveling with Jesus would be so exciting.

We began traveling in Galilee. Jesus would stop in the synagogues to preach. People were interested in hearing from Jesus. It could have been curiosity that drew people to Jesus; I know that is what made me pack my bag and tag along with Jesus and his disciples. Everywhere we went, people gathered to hear what Jesus was saying.

I must confess that I wasn't listening to what Jesus said. There was so much to see. For a mouse that had never ventured far from home, this was an incredible adventure. There were so many new things to see, smell, and taste, whenever I got a chance. I was continually in awe of all the people and places we were seeing.

I don't think I was the only one who wasn't listening. Peter, Andrew, James and John seemed a little awe struck, too. They sure were enjoying being close to Jesus and all the attention they were getting. I think I saw Jesus shake his head at them once as they stared at the crowd, instead of listening to what he was saying. I couldn't judge them, because I had no idea what Jesus was saying either.

As we traveled from place to place, the word spread about Jesus. I don't know that people were talking about what he was saying, but they sure were talking about what he was doing. Jesus was healing the sick. He cured people who were ill with lots of different diseases, those who were suffering severe pain, the demon-possessed, people who were having seizures and the paralyzed. I can't describe what it was like the first time I saw someone get up and walk after being carried into the synagogue to see Jesus. It was amazing! Everyone was so excited, talking, shouting, pushing to get closer to Jesus. Through it all, Jesus remained calm. I can't quite describe what it is like to be near Jesus.

When we were in Capernaum, we went to the synagogue on the Sabbath. I almost got left behind because I was taking a nap when they were leaving. I hurried to catch up because I did not want to miss anything.

The visit began as expected. Jesus began to teach. The people were amazed at his teaching. He has this way about him. He is kind when he teaches, but he teaches with authority. Those two things don't seem to mix, but they do. He didn't quote any human teacher. It was as if he had talked to God and was sharing what he learned directly from God with the crowd. People were spell bound listening to him. I will admit I was beginning to wonder what he was saying that was so important.

Before I could really follow what Jesus was saying, a man shouted, "What do you want with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are – the Holy One of God!" Well, this got everyone's attention. I think you could have heard a whisker twitch. Without missing a beat, Jesus sternly said, "Be quiet! Come out of him!" Next, the man began to shake so hard that I thought he was going to be seriously hurt, then before my eyes, an evil spirit came out of the man with a shriek. The man was uninjured, but exhausted.

I was so shocked at what I had seen. How did Jesus know it was an evil spirit talking? How did he get it to come out with just a command? Everyone around me was talking. They were asking each other what had happened and who is this Jesus. They could not get over that Jesus was able to teach with such authority and then use that same authority to drive out an evil spirit.

That night as I lay at Jesus' feet, I listened closely as he talked with the disciples. There was so much I wanted to learn, so much I wanted to know. Jesus was more than I thought he was. I still wasn't sure what was going on, but I was going to pay a lot more attention so that I could find out.

This adventure started merely as a way to see the world and uncover the mystery of why grown men would leave their jobs to follow a stranger. It is turning into something more. The longer I travel with Jesus and his disciples, the more questions I seem to have.

I can't wait to see what tomorrow will bring, though right now I am tired and need to get some sleep. I am going to curl up in Simon's bag tonight and hope he doesn't dump me out looking for something. This adventure is turning out to be more than I ever dreamed it would be.

Holy Week 2019

Holy Week begins on Palm Sunday (April 14, 2019) and ends on Easter (April 21, 2019). This is a time for us to reflect and worship together. We remember Jesus' life, death and resurrection as we worship together.

Palm Sunday, Sunday, April 14, 2019 at 10 am

Palm Sunday is the Sunday before <u>Easter</u> that begins the Holy Week. It is the day that we remember and celebrate the day Jesus entered into Jerusalem as Savior and King. As Jesus rode a donkey into the town of Jerusalem a large crowd gathered and laid palm branches and their cloaks across the road, giving Jesus royal treatment. The hundreds of people shouted "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest heaven!" We will pass our palms during worship as we praise Christ the King!

Maundy Thursday, April 18, 2019 at 7:30 pm

Maundy Thursday is believed to be the day when Jesus celebrated his final Passover with His disciples. Most notably, that Passover meal was when Jesus washed the feet of His disciples in an extraordinary display of humility. He then commanded them to do the same for each other.

<u>Christ</u>'s "mandate" is commemorated on Maundy Thursday----"maundy" being a shortened form of mandatum (Latin), which means "command." It was on the Thursday of Christ's final week before being crucified and resurrected that He said these words to his disciples:

"A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another" (John 13:34).

At this service we will celebrate communion together as well as remember Jesus' time in the garden, praying *Thy will be done*, and his arrest.

Good Friday, April 19, 2019 at 7:30 pm

Good Friday is the day we remember Jesus willingly dying on the cross for the forgiveness of our sins. The day in itself is not good. It is only good because of what happens next. This day marks the dramatic culmination of God's plan to save his people from their sins. Jesus knew from his birth where his life would take him. In this service we will contemplate the crucifixion and what it means to us.

Resurrection/Easter Sunday, April 21, 2019 at 6:30 am (breakfast following) and 10 am

Hallelujah, Christ is Risen. Together we gather with joy to celebrate our Living Lord. The grave could not hold him. There is no greater gift than knowing that our God lives. Join us in the cemetery as we remember the early morning visitors finding the tomb empty and then again as we worship together in the sanctuary continuing to celebrate our Risen Savior.

Holy Week is a time for us to gather together in worship, to remember what God has done for us, and to recommit ourselves to following Him. I hope you will join us as we gather to remember, celebrate and dedicate ourselves to God.
