## Church Website


We are excited to announce our revamped website is live. Go to [www.uplandbaptist.org](http://www.uplandbaptist.org) to keep up to date on what's happening.

## Devotional Thought...

### Consider the Lilies.... Matthew 6: 25-34 (NIV)

“Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink, or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothes? Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your Heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? Can anyone of you by worrying add a single hour to your life? Why do you worry about clothes? See the flowers of the field and how they grow. They do not labor or spin. And yet I tell you that not even Solomon in all of his splendor was dressed as one of these. If that is how God clothes the grass of the field, which is here today, and tomorrow is thrown into the fire, will he not that much more clothe you, oh ye of little faith? So do not worry, saying, what shall we eat?, what shall we drink?, or what shall we wear? For the pagans run after these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them. But seek first His kingdom and His righteousness, and all of these things will be given to you as well. Therefore, do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own.”



Many years ago after my mother died, my father and I purchased a lily in her memory to adorn the church sanctuary at Easter. After it was home with us for awhile and the weather was favorable, I planted it outside. It faithfully appeared and blossomed for several springs until one season the gentleman who mowed the lawn inadvertently included it while weed whacking the weeds. I thought it was gone forever, but the next spring a few leaves appeared and the spring following that, a few more leaves.

This season not only did the plant return, but it brought forth two beautiful flowers! I was very excited, but even more ecstatic when, while admiring this plant, I was reminded of the passage above. God is omniscient (all knowing), omnipresent (all places), and omnipotent (all powerful). In Philippians 4:19 the Apostle Paul assures the Christians in Philippi that “... God will supply all your needs according to His riches in Christ Jesus.” God truly has His eye on the sparrow, and the lilies, and His beloved children. There is nothing that we will encounter today (or tomorrow) that our God can't handle!
