In addition to lesson and administrative materials, your donations allowed us to provide students with a goodie bag on their final day. We are always grateful for your support of this ministry.



Devotional Thought...

"Because of the Lord's great love we are not consumed, for his compassion never fail. They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness."

— Lamentations 3:22–23

We all need a fresh start sometimes. Whether it's after a failure, a season of spiritual dryness, or just the daily wear and tear of life, our hearts long for a reset—a clean slate and a new beginning.

The good news? God specializes in fresh starts.

In Lamentations 3, the prophet Jeremiah writes

from a place of deep grief and brokenness. Jerusalem has fallen, the people are suffering, and hope seems far away. But right in the middle of the sorrow, Jeremiah remembers something powerful: God's compassions never fail. In fact, they are new every morning.

What a beautiful picture of God's mercy. It doesn't come in limited supply. It doesn't run out. Every single day, no matter what yesterday looked like, God offers a fresh start. Not because we earned it—but because He is faithful and loving.

A fresh start doesn't always mean your circumstances instantly change. Often, it begins in the heart. It's a shift in mindset, a choice to believe again, to forgive again, to trust again. It's letting God breathe new life into weary places.

In 2 Corinthians 5:17, Paul writes, "If anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!" That's more than a nice saying—it's a spiritual reality. When we come to Jesus, we are made new. Our sins are forgiven, our past is redeemed, and our future is full of hope.

Maybe you've been holding on to guilt or shame. Maybe you've drifted from God and feel like it's too late to turn back. Hear this truth: **It's never too late for a fresh start with God.** He's not waiting to condemn you—He's waiting to restore you.

Starting fresh may require letting go of pride, control, bitterness, or fear. But what we gain is far greater: peace, purpose, and the joy of walking closely with our Creator again.
